"Sitting in Circles With Rich White Girls," the new show at Brownbox

Seattle-based poet Chad Goller-Sojourner premieres a new autobiographical show with a catchy title: "Sitting in Circles With Rich White Girls: Memoirs of a Bulimic Black Boy."

Curious yet? Goller-Sojourner surely has plenty of material to work with. Presented by the black theater company Brownbox, "Bulimic Black Boy" chronicles 10 years of dealing with an eating disorder, and the somber and humorous aspects of "growing up fat, dark-skinned, gay and adopted by white folks."
